Friends Annual Program Plan

During the Board's January Mini-Retreat we worked with Park Manager Tim Pharis to jointly sign off on our first TN State Parks Program Plan.

2 PROGRAM GOALS:

- ✓ Implement the All Terrain Wheelchair project to meet all Reeve Foundation grant requirements. <u>STATUS</u>: ACHIEVED
- ✓ Formalize Trail Adoption Program <u>STATUS</u>: Formalized the program. Identified need to develop better tracking of trail adoption work next year.

Friends Annual Program Plan

2 FUNDRAISING GOALS:

- ✓ Upper East TN Fiddlers Convention. <u>STATUS</u>: Projected to raise \$2500 Net. Actual Net came in at \$3439.30
- ✓ Campaign to support All Terrain Wheelchair project. <u>STATUS</u>:
 - Transport Trailer Denny Bokemeier wrote Rotary Grant which was approved. TN State Parks also provided a trailer to the park.
 - Grading of Trails Main trail for Wheelchair was determined not to need additional grading.
 - Flint Mountain Trail grading was needed. \$10,000 cost for grading was covered by a \$5000 donation, \$2500 from the TN State Parks Spring Fundraiser and \$2500 from the Friends.









Erwin Outdoor Festival



• Friends and ETTA Members worked with Park Ranger Cory to clear and reopen the field you see on the left after going over the ADA metal bridge.








TN State Parks Friends Conference
