Featured Park Events

Wildflower hikes, Full Moon hikes, and more are being scheduled. In each visit to Rocky Fork you can witness Spring as the magnificent transition from winter to summer and the cycle of life.

Wildflowers start blooming in March and generally fade in June. Some flowers found at lower elevations in March will be found at higher elevations in April and May. The trees start blooming with buds and sunlight hits the forest floor allowing the flowers to quickly take over until the canopy blocks the sunlight in June.

TWRA stocks Rocky Fork Creek with rainbow trout. Trout prefer clean cold water. Native brook trout live upstream at higher elevations. There are many aquatic invertebrates that hatch in late spring allowing trout to survive.

Did you know? The Sun is equally over the equator on March 20 at 5:24 EST. It is Spring to the north of the equator and Fall to the south of the Equator. As summer approaches the earth orbit continues to rotate on its axis at 23.5 degrees and the rays move north creating summer.

Park Kiosks and Benches


