Fun statistics from 2023:

43,000 vehicles visited the park

3,500 people attended programs and events

93 campground reservations

109 attendees for Folk School Classes – featuring Maple Sugaring, Cherokee Baskets, Stone Masonry, Bark Baskets, Flint Knappina, Broom Making, Pine Needle Baskets. Classes in 2024 are being added. Maple sugaring, Cobweb Broom making, Apple tree grafting. Watch for more to be scheduled each month.

The RFSP Visitor Center project kicked off on October 26, 2023 and is in the Schematic Design phase. We will provide updates on progress through 2024. Design, Contracting, Construction phases will tentatively complete with a Grand Opening in March of 2026.

RFSP will be hosting a **Bioblitz** for the entirety of 2024 through iNaturalist! What does this mean? It means YOU get to be the scientist and help our team identify species within our park boundaries. It is as simple as taking a picture. The Friends of Rocky Fork State Park support the Park and Park staff with projects and funding.

Our Friends of Rocky Fork State Park Annual Meeting and Board Elections was held on Monday, December 4th at the Erwin Town Hall.

Park Manager Tim shared statistics of visitors and programs in 2023. He talked about plans for Flint Mountain Trail, High Point Trail, eradicating some of the social trails that impact the health of the creeks, and expanding use of the All Terrain Wheelchair. He's looking forward to the start of RFSP Visitor Center planning.

Capital Projects Manager Don Tate shared the process and timeline for the RFSP Visitor Center. Design and contracting will be most of 2024, Construction to start by year end. Grand Opening tentatively slated for 2026. It will include a Lobby/Reception Area, Gift Shop, Interpretive Space, Public/Private Meeting Space to accommodate 30 people, Restrooms, Ranger Work Area, Administrative Areas, Park Manager/HR Office Space.

Park Ranger Cory wrapped up the year with a summary of the interpretive programs and events at the park.

- Upper East TN Fiddlers Convention 400+ people attended, 150 contestants
- Firefly Lottery up 82% to 15,560 entries from around the world!
- Folk School Classes took off and sold out almost immediately. 109 attendees experienced hands-on techniques led by expert craftspeople.
- 180 people experience Full Moon hikes the most attended program at the park.
- There were 128 programs at the park, 2,018 attendees.
 Were you one of them?
- Seasonal Interpretive Ranger Connor offered a variety of new programs (59) with 871 attendees. Good news for us – he will be back in the park soon!

We welcomed **new FRFSP Board Member Mike Barroso**. He's a longtime Friend who has been active in the park for many years. His bio line – He Shows Up!

Thank you to outgoing Board Member **Emily Goepel**, who luckily for us will continue helping with specials projects and Meet The Mountains Festival. We are grateful for her dedication to the park!

The Friends of Rocky Fork shared our 2023 support of RFSP at the Annual Meeting

In 2023, the FRFSP participated in trail maintenance, cleanups, built benches and kiosks, provided funding for campsite privies in conjunction with NFS, cleared a historic field just after the bridge, led guided hikes for hiking and conservation groups, supported park guided hikes for hiking and conservation groups, supported park events (Fiddlers Convention and Fireflies), set up at festivals (Erwin Outdoor Festival and Meet The Mountains), promoted a new fundraising event Yoga on Tap, hosted State of Franklin Track Club for the Bear Paw Trail and Bat Road races, and created a Halloween Storytelling & Scavenger Hunt event. We attended the TN State Park Friends Conference and presented the benefits of newsletters.


