
## Blue Ghost and Synchronous Fireflies - Viewings

The Friends arranged for and hosted noted entomologist, Dr. Will Kuhn who gave a free public lecture on the Fireflies prior to the viewing dates.


#### We hosted a Members Only Firefly Social at the new Ranger Station followed by nighttime Firefly viewing in the Park







So, this event is a rare and excellent time to see the beautiful and mysterious side of RFSP. The whitewater reflects the moon and shines back brightly as we all observe the nocturnal critters like Barred Owls and Yonalossee Salamanders. Our Full Moon Hikes are special because Rocky Fork is one of the darkest public lands in the state, which allows participants greater opportunities for viewing the Moon. Reservations required \$5

Snorkeling the Fork- Join Ranger Joe in the crisp, cool waters of Rocky Fork. The shallow mountains treams are a great way to cool off on these muggy summer days. Not only will you be able to shed the heat, you will observe many magnificent animals that reside just below the surface of this coldwater fishery. Teaming with salamanders and rainbow trout and local aquatic life native to the greater Blue Ridge Ecosystem, this shallow water snorkeling experience is an event not to missed. 
